Description

Course Description: This course covers the development of the drug cartels and their organization, production, and distribution networks. This course will focus on the regions known as the Golden Triangle and Golden Crescent, and the drugs that are typically manufactured and transported from these areas. This course also provides an overview of U.S. counter-drug efforts and basic information on illicit drugs. Additionally this course provides an historical overview of drug trafficking including a focus on the opium wars in China.

Course Scope:

The scope of this class will analyze the history of the international drug trade and the war on drugs. Particular focus will be on the impact of colonization, the culture of drug producing regions, the organization of smuggling operations and U.S. involvement in the international drug trade system. This class will provide the student with the ability to understand the complex dynamics that exist within the world's drug problem.
