Course : DEFM310 **Title :** Program and Acquisition Management I **Length of Course :** 8 **Prerequisites :** N/A **Credit Hours :** 3

Description

Course Description: This course is an introduction to the requirements of successful program management in the DOD. The course will look at the entire systems acquisition cycle from the point of view of government requirements and the efforts of the civilian contractor to bring the system to Full Operational Capacity.

Course Scope:

This course will expose students to the program management process employed throughout the Department of Defense today. Program management history, along with the roles, responsibilities, and authority of a program manager, will be examined. Additionally, program management issues in a Joint environment will be reviewed. The bridge between program management and acquisition will be linked with a discussion on program management in defense acquisition. Students will assess the acquisition cycle from Initial Operational Capability to Full Operational Capability; with a focus on the DoD acquisition process, key personnel, and acquisition organizations. This course concludes with an in-depth examination of Joint war-fighting acquisition needs, the acquisition management framework, and the resource allocation process.

Objectives

After successfully completing this course, students will fulfill the following Learning Objectives (LO):

LO-1 Describe the roles and responsibilities of the Executive Branch, Congress, and defense industry in Defense Acquisition, and where defense acquisition authority is derived

LO-2 Describe several historical legislative acts that have institutionalized better business practices within the DoD acquisition community.

LO-3 Characterize the roles and responsibilities of the *Lead Component, Participating Component,* and *Joint Program Manager*

LO-4 Explain how DoD acquisition takes place, including who is responsible for DoD acquisition.

LO-5 Create a Joint Capabilities Integration and Development System (JCIDS) capability scenario.

LO-6 Identify events that trigger/define Initial Operational Capability (IOC), Full Operational Capability (FOC), and Milestone A, B, & C.

LO-7 Describe the four phases of the resource allocation process.

LO-8 Summarize the program and acquisition management process and key concepts.
