Course Description (Catalog)

This course will introduce Coaching Leadership on a sports level but show how the leadership can relate to personal, business and everyday successes for individuals. Creating success in the sports arena, a leader has to communicate, in a way, to bring a set of individuals together to accomplish one common goal. To be a good leader and coach, one must motivate teamwork and reveal the powerful characteristics of success. Leadership can be universal and used in any walk of life. Coaches are faced with many hurdles to overcome on different levels. The best coaches are able to work through these barriers and develop systems that bring teammates together with a

common purpose. Course objectives will be reached by means of selected case studies and focused assignments, reinforced by study of proven coaching leaders.

Course Scope

This course will be delivered over an 8-week time frame. Through the course students will be able to study from three great leaders in sports. Dean Smith has had many successes in the sports arena. An in-depth look will be deployed to understand the leadership techniques of forming a team to molding that team into a championship level team to making a tradition and dynasty out of that team. Even though many teams may not reach the dynasty stage it is important to realize what traditions are important to any team or business. Ideas such as complacency and adversity will be studied as well. Furthermore, throughout this class the student will be asked to reflect on how concepts learned can be related to their own life. These concepts can be correlated to any walk of life and career. It is important to remember that life lessons can be learned through sports. Mainly the book chosen as well as research of other leaders will be the delivery method for this class. From time to time during group discussion current events and other books may be used.

Each week during the course will focus on one or two main topics. These topics will be reinforced through weekly discussion topics, written assignments, and presentations. Students will be able to share life experiences with other students during the group discussion. The group discussion will be a tool used to allow all students to interact with other students and the professor.

Course Objectives

The successful student will fulfill the following objectives:

- 1. Explain the major components involved in the leadership of coaching
- 2. Analyze the different styles and communication leadership skills.
- 3. Identify how coaching leadership skills relate to everyday experiences in life
- 4. Analyze coaching philosophies and develop a coaching philosophy
- 5. Describe and define success as it pertains to field of competition and to life.
- 6. Understand the importance of goal setting to team success.
- 7. Learn the importance of practice planning
- 8. Identify how to instill confidence into your team

Course Delivery Method

This master's in <u>Coaching Leadership</u> course delivered via distance learning will enable students to complete academic work in a flexible manner, completely online. Course materials and access to an online learning management system will be made available to each student. **Online assignments are due each week** and include discussion forum questions (accomplished in

groups through a threaded forum), and individual assignments (submitted for review by the faculty member). The initial forum post responding to the question posed is due by Wednesday each week, and responses to classmates' posts are due by Sunday. Assigned faculty will support the students throughout this eight-week course.

Evaluation Procedures

Forums – Each week there will be a discussion topic. These discussion topics will either come from Dean Smith's book or from current events. Each week a question or statement will be posted and the students will be asked to discuss the particular topic. The discussion of the topic will be based on the student's personal experiences, lecture notes and readings. It is important that all students interact with their fellow classmates. This will allow for optimal learning. Each student has different life experiences from which all students can learn. Students are required to submit their first response by **Wednesday** and then respond to at least two classmates by Sunday. There will be a total of eight discussion forums worth 10 points each.

Assignments – There will be three assignments due week two, three, and six. Remember resources should be cited when used both in the paper and on the reference page using proper APA format. ****Be sure to include an APA formatted title page and reference page (if you referenced any material) with ALL assignments.****

Final Project – Due the eighth week the final project is a PowerPoint presentation for a class or team with you as the leader/instructor. The presentation is about one of the topics (leadership, planning, etc) discussed in the class and why it is an important area in the coaching profession. The PowerPoint must be in bullet format such that it is a guide for your lecture since

the actual lecture will be part of the notes section. Feel free to use resources on the Internet, in the textbooks and any examples in your life experience to help you preparing your lecture. The project is worth 100 points.

Interaction and Ongoing Participation and Contact - You are expected to interact with your fellow students as much as possible and participate in all forum posts. Posts should be insightful, show that you are thinking outside the box, and adhere to the minimum word counts. Comments on your classmates' posts should challenge and/or question their position.
